


Technology Needs Assessment - countries






Criteria for prioritization

Uganda TNA 2019,

- Ability to reduce labor demand for both women and men.
- Number of women, men and youth gaining from the technology.
- Congruence of the technology with existing social norms and cultures, increasing employment, catering for needs of women, men, children and the youth, inclusiveness of indigenous knowledge in establishment an operation.

• Ability of the technology to reduce gender inequality
