Recommendation 1

Encourages national and international actors to consider prioritizing resources (human, organizational, financial), in accordance with their needs, priorities, and capacities, for scaling-up and speeding-up technological innovation for implementing NDCs, NAPs and mid-century strategies

Recommendation 2

Encourages countries to consider enhancing public and private participation in the RD&D of climate technologies that may support the implementation of NDCs, NAPs, and mid-century strategies by increasing public expenditure for such RD&D and providing a clear policy signal of a long-term national commitment to act on climate change



Recommendation 3

Encourages countries to create favorable conditions for the widespread use of climate technologies by developing supportive policy environments, facilitating market creation and expansion, and promoting capacity-building

Recommendation 4

Encourages countries to enhance existing and build new collaborative initiatives on climate technology innovation which may support NDC, NAP and mid-century strategy implementation, including for technology development and transfer and the sharing of expertise, good practices and lessons learned



Recommendation 5

Encourages the TEC, CTCN, SCF, GEF and GCF to collaborate in identifying effective policies, instruments and collaboration forms that support developing countries and international partners to enhance their technological innovation efforts for achieving the Paris Agreement's objectives

Recommendation 6

Invites the Green Climate Fund to share information in its annual report on projects it approved that support the innovation and scaling-up of climate technologies, with the aim of informing the Technology Mechanism as it undertakes further work on climate technology innovation.
