Procedural background

- ➤ In 2016, COP requested that all constituted bodies include in their regular reports progress made towards the integration of gender perspectives in their respective processes (decision 21/CP.22)
- > Three additional requests support this reporting request:
 - ☐ Technical paper identifying entry points for integrating gender a perspective in each the work of each constituted body (decision 21/CP.22), document FCCC/TP/2018/1



Procedural background cont.

- □ Dialogue with Chairs of constituted bodies to discuss outcome of the technical paper organized during SB48 – informal report of the Dialogue is available on UNFCCC website (decision 3/CP.23, GAP activity C.1)
- □ Secretariat gender team, together with relevant organisations, to offer **capacity-building** for the Chairs and members of constituted bodies on integrating gender considerations in their workstreams (decision 3/CP.23, GAP activity C.2)



Tailored sessions

- ➤ Tailored sessions are being offered to all constituted bodies e.g.
 - ✓ Gender 101 webinar, Part 1 of 2 sessions developed with
 the Paris Committee on Capacity Building
 - ✓ Webinar was open to members of all constituted bodies.
 - ✓ Recording and presentations will be available on PCCB webpage
 - ✓ Part 2 will be an in-person workshop with PCCB during
 COP 24



Tailored sessions cont.

- ➤ Tailored sessions developed at the request and in consultation with the constituted body, could be:
 - In-person knowledge exchange or technical session with relevant gender experts
 - In the context e.g. of the CDM EB's current or upcoming activities
 - In conjunction with a regular meeting or with COPs, SBs
 - Other modality



Recommendations to the Board

The Board may wish to request a tailored capacity-building / technical session, to be undertaken in 2019, on opportunities for integrating gender considerations in CDM EB activities, taking into account recommendations from the technical paper as well as other ideas the Board may have.
