# Recommendations on ways forward and actions to be taken based on the outcomes of the TEMs on mitigation

## Background

- COP 23, through decision 12/CP.23, requested the TEC to include in its annual report recommendations for Parties and other organizations on ways forward and necessary actions to be taken based on the outcomes of the TEMs.
- At TEC 16, the TEC requested the task force on mitigation to prepare such recommendations based on the outcomes of TEM-Ms.
- In 2018, the TEC participated to three regional TEM-Ms (Africa, Asia Pacific, and Latin America and the Caribbean) and in in-session TEM-M in Bonn. The TEM-M topics were: efficiency in industry, waste-to-energy, circular economy.

## Recommendations of the TEC

- The recommendations are structured into three main sections:
  1. Highlights on organizational aspects of the TEM-M:
    - Effectiveness of the regional setting in ensuring broader stakeholder participation, engaging expert organisation and focussing discussions on specific local needs.
  2. Underlining the challenges and opportunities for waste-to-energy technologies and implementation of circular economy

3. Recommendations to COP about:

- **Promotion of policies and programmes** that incentivize waste reuse and recycling and stimulate investments from the private sectors
- **Enhancement of the capacities** of various actors
- Encouragement of **collaboration and knowledge sharing** among relevant actors
- Invitation to relevant organizations to **finance or co-finance pilot projects and demonstration projects** for waste-to-energy and circular economy

## Expected action

- The TEC is invited to consider and agree on the recommendations
- The recommendations will be submitted to the SB chairs, the CTCN, the Adaptation Committee, the high-level champions and included as annex in the joint annual report of the TEC and the CTCN for 2018.
